

- Not itself a denomination, or a separate tradition. Rather, a partnership between denominations, expressed within one congregation



- One structure (amongst many options) which enables a collaboration between denominations to serve the Kingdom of God
- To enable mission and ministry –
   *meant to make it easier*





#### A good idea in its time

- Into new housing estates, where a combined Christian witness was needed
- Where each denomination provided a minister, who worked as part of a team
- In a culture which wanted representation and sophisticated rules to govern meetings
- And yet did not have Policies on Safeguarding, Health and Safety etc
- In a society where there was more volunteer time

What has changed? Why now?

- Denominations unable to resource paid ministry – no longer Baptist/URC paid ministry, Methodists likely to withdraw within a couple of years. Anglican are able to fund next incumbent.
- Yet ministers and SCLEP have to fulfil requirements from all four denominations, including financial contributions, duplication
- Less volunteer time to manage this
- Culture is more informally collaborative
- Likely to be very difficult to recruit next Anglican incumbent to an SCLEP



#### A future pattern?

- A new *structure*
- A denominational alignment consistent practice on policies, finance, ministry
- An ecumenical culture the best of what you are.
   Worship, care, collaboration, mission, licensed preachers
- Church of England committed to replacing Clive when he retires; to continue Diocese of Bristol ownership of Lydiard Tregoze and Shaw
- Work alongside ecumenical partners, in a light touch structure

The 4 churches that remain have a significant amount of work to reorganise under their chosen denomination. However denominational choices come with support (and standard templates for charity etc) The choice also comes with limitations of clergy appointment, acceptance of ministry from other denominations, use of the building etc. Westlea seems to have more flexibility, but in some of our scenarios more work to do.
