Welcome - Rev Dick Gray welcomed those assembled. He pointed out fire exits and directions to toilets, including more accessible facilities.

Our purpose. Covenanted together for mission - We exist in order to BE the People of God and EXTEND the Kingdom of God throughout West Swindon and The Lydiards

Revs Tudor and Tricia Roberts hosted a quiz on the partnership – its geography and history, and listed the values of the partnership. Sweets may have been given as prizes.

What has the Partnership done?

The Partnership has been active in many areas: introducing new Christians through courses, Confirmation, Baptism and Marriage preparation, our Lent course and other teaching opportunities. We share administration.

Janet Gray talked about Messy Church, a valuable and growing work but in serious need of further helpers. As this was one of the Partnership goals, and helps to fulfil our Missions statement to Bring the Kingdom of God to the people of West Swindon and the Lydiards, it is a whole Partnership responsibility to promote and support it.

Claire Camm talked about emerge organisation and our Youth work The aims of the emerge youth project are for young people to:

- Discover & Develop talents
- Grow in self-esteem
- Make new friends
- Develop life skills
- Explore spirituality
- Mature as caring and responsible individuals within the community

Older young people left for their discussion group

Rev Clive Deverell asked folk to put their hands up if they had been involved with these joint activities. Clive then spoke about his Church Army colleague, that he'd seen recently, who is now a chaplain at the Chelsea Hospital, Many years ago she had been at Westlea and the partnership had been instrumental in her call into ministry. We should give thanks for seeds sown in the past, we may never know what fruit is borne through our actions.

Finances:

Sue Green introduced highlights of the consolidated finance report

Sue explained the main differences between 2012 & 2011 was St Mary's building work that came out of restricted funds. She showed the proportions of income that comes via each of the local churches, via grants for youthwork, the office, and fees for occasional offices.

Sue also summarised the proportions of outgoings towards the Anglican quota, our Baptist minister, manse, staff expenses etc. In 2012, because we knew the individual churches were unlikely to meet the amount we had budgeted for we gave £12,000 less towards the diocese quota. We hope to make up some of this shortfall in 2013.

- G referring to a call for foundation governors at Oliver Tomkins Schools

Policies:

Chris Scarisbrick read out the partnership policies. Changes to the wording were not in order. There were no questions. The following wordings were all agreed and re-adopted with no objections.

Child Protection - Safe to grow

Children and young people belong to our church today. They have much to give as well as receive. We need to listen to them. As we nurture them in worship, learning and in community life, we will pay appropriate respect to the wishes and feelings of children and young people.

• Vulnerable adults

The protection of vulnerable adults is the responsibility of every church member. We seek to involve such people in all aspects of the church's life, and therefore all members will be involved with them in various aspects of the activities we undertake together. We are committed to providing any additional training and support which are needed by those who are particularly involved in supporting the vulnerable

Accessibility

We believe that all people are equally loved and accepted by God. We believe that all people should have an equal opportunity to experience the love of God, to grow spiritually, and to participate in worship and share fully in the life of the Church.

Health & Safety

We will provide adequate control of the health and safety risks arising from our activities.

Information security

The church is essentially a relationship-based organisation. We will collect personal information only as necessary. We will store such information securely. We will use such information only for the purposes for which it was given. Everyone has the right to see all information we hold that pertains to them. We will correct information when asked. Subject to regulatory constraints we will delete information when asked to do so, or when it is no longer necessary.

What is God asking of us?

Dick said it is better to do things together. Sometimes harder than doing them separately, but usually better.

Our mission is not to make new members, although that might be a by-product, it is to show people the love of God, as demonstrated by Jesus Christ, and to enable them to become followers of Jesus.

We sometimes need to set aside personal preferences and parochialism to become more effective disciples.

Hopes for 2013-4

Chris Scarisbrick introduced the goals that our Partnership Council proposes to work on as its primary areas of focus in 2013/4

- Reach out to Children and Young people through our local churches and together via Messy Church, Schools work and Emerge
- Develop ways to help lay members to contribute to the mission of the churches and Partnership.
- Engage an external convenor, consult and decide the shape of our partnership, and how it will be managed and work in future. Implement the recommendations.

There were no questions at the time, and the proposals were approved with no objections. A member afterwards questioned the wisdom of committing to implement as yet unknown recommendations. It was suggested that if we don't, Partnership Council should give a good reason to next year's AGM.
