# **Safeguarding Report**

We are committed to ensuring that Toothill Church is a safe space for everyone, especially children, young people and vulnerable adults.

All church office holders and committee members are DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) registered and have undertaken training at either foundation or leadership level.

#### Welcome Space

The Welcome Space has been active since January 2023 and has grown in numbers over the past year. Our members consist of people from the Toothill Church to people from the community, we also have a mother and baby attending.

We are privileged to have members of the Swindon Borough Council and Councillors attending as well, and who are able to talk to the members about their concerns about the cost of living and about the community. Tony and I would like to thank those for attending and giving their support.

The Welcome Space offers free refreshments and lunch consisting of Soups and bread followed by cake or biscuits. There is a free raffle which consists of gifts and food, also a FREE table of clothes, books and many more items for members to take home.

We supply games, jigsaws, crafts, newspapers and women's magazines, members can also bring their own crafts with them. We have music playing quietly in the background and on occasions Nicola has played music on the organ, Thank you Nicola.

There have been 2 highlights of the year at the Welcome Space, firstly in July we had a Recycle sale. Tony and I were amazed how well we did. The attendance of the community was high, we made £300 for the restricted Welcome Space Fund, again thank you to those who supported the sale.

# **Tinies & Friday Club Report**

In 2023 the number of children attending the Tinies and the Friday Club were maintained through the year. We lost a few volunteers, but they were replaced by new volunteers.

The number of children attending Tinies have increased slightly and is about 20 to 30 toddlers at each session. The toddlers are given a snack at the end of the session with a sing-a-along organised by the parents before the end. The number of children attending Friday Club remains very high but with the introduction of the booking system we have been able to manage the number of children attending each session. The numbers range from 25 to 40 children per session. The children continue to enjoy the singing, crafts, colouring, games, and the outdoor activities during the summer. Each session ends with a sit down 'mini supper' after a prayer by one of the children. The menu is different each week and includes Pasta and Sauce, Pizza, Sausages, Chicken Nuggets, Chips and Sandwiches.

We had a trip organised to Chessington Park for all the groups. There were 33 children and 10 adults that went on the trip. There were three main occasions in church that the children took part in, these were the International Day Service, Mothering Sunday Celebration and the Children's Christmas Service with readings and singing. The three occasions were very well attended by the children and their families. The groups had their Christmas Parties with Father Christmas in attendance.

# West Swindon Youth Club

The club is for secondary aged children in the West Swindon and surrounding areas. On average we have about 20 children attending on the weekly sessions.

# for them. However, in 2023 we paid £5,419 for gas alone!

One of the duties (and privileges) of a church is to dispense charity. In 2023 we gave £5,130 (just under 20% of our total receipts) to charity – notably to *Glona Bring Hope* in Ghana and *Swindon Night Shelter* (£750 to each), and £530 to our local charity *The Filling Station*. We have also dispensed £1,000 (the first *Heat and Eat* donation) and £850 of the second. Finally, Cynthia Dowdeswell's legacy was finished by purchasing six armchairs and updating the central heating control system.

# **Receipts against Payments**

The '<u>Receipts and Payments Statement'</u> (below) shows that we overspent our budget by £5,828. Our analysis points to several causes but the most obvious are soaring energy costs, increasing the payments to the Partnership, and justifiable payments made under 'Maintenance and Equipment'. However, we look on the bright side. Our assets are adequate in that we carry forward £11,364 into 2024, these being held in our Bank and Methodist Saver accounts.

#### For 2024

The year ahead will be testing, but we have confidence in The One who is looking after us! The rectification of the floor cracking in the main hall will possibly/probably be very expensive. In national life we face the prospect of still higher energy costs (scheduled to increase by 5% in January); if the enclosed <u>'Budget 2024'</u> goes as planned we could spend up to 38% of our total receipts on utilities! Both issues will certainly impact our mission here in Toothill. Furthermore, as the Partnership dissolves and we transition to being a Methodist Church there will undoubtedly be further changes. Change, whether we like it or not, is an inevitable part of life: let us go forward with faith, confidence and, above all, prayer!

#### Introduction

The financial dealings of many churches are a balance of depending upon Our Lord (living by faith) and being good stewards of the money He has given us. Sometimes we must step out in faith trusting Him; at other times we must pause and discern what He is trying to tell us. 2023 typified, for us, both cases.

But before I go any further, I would like to say thank you – on behalf of the Church Committee – to everyone who has given so generously to The Lord's work here in Toothill Church. Our regular collections (not including donations) averaged £1,234 per month, a wonderful achievement considering the numbers in our congregation!

#### Receipts

One of the most remarkable features has been our receipt of donations: just under 20 times what we budgeted! We received another large anonymous gift to help those struggling with high food and energy costs in our area. We also received two substantial rebates from our former gas supplier which – together with the 2022 heating grant from the Anglican Church – helped to reduce our soaring gas bills.

#### Payments

We began 2023 paying a reduced share to the West Swindon Partnership; however, in response to an appeal from them for help we raised this, after prayer and consideration, from £6,000 to £10,000 for the year. On top of this our energy costs have been truly prodigious. Our running costs comprise utilities and insurance; in 2022 we paid <u>a total</u> of £3,968

It operates on a grant from the West Swindon Parish Council to the New Generation Bond CIC. The group was very grateful to Toothill Church for allowing the group to use the church rent free whilst we were applying for more grants. We were successful in September in getting a grant from the West Swindon Parish Council.

There are board games, pool table, basketball/netball post and other activities that the children can take part in. They sometimes have a cooking or baking competitions and play games on the church grass during the summer months. The children are also offered something to eat before the end of each session.

The Chessington trip was an initiative from the children from the Youth Club. Some of them did sponsored activities to raise funds towards the cost of the trip.

# **Open the Book**

We are delighted to be going into Hazelwood Academy with Open the Book. As the name suggests we dramatise Bible stories for the school children. We approached the school in September and have had a terrific response. Several members of staff, including the Head teacher, have been very supportive. Previously the school teacher had been unable to make contact with church or OtB. We believe God has opened the doors for us to take His word into our local school.

We go in once a month to take the assembly slot of about half an hour. Our team is drawn from 2 members of Toothill church, plus 3 who go to other churches but live in Toothill.

Alongside our visits to the school, the children have been into Toothill

church twice. For a harvest and Christmas service where the OtB team served by doing relevant dramas. Response from staff and parents was that they felt welcome, loved the acoustics and that the church was warm! We are offering the school The Easter Experience this year.

Going forward please pray for God's continued favour on this work, strength for the team and the children to be impacted by what they hear. Every blessings
