

When I was a young lad I followed my brothers and became a choirboy in our church of St Martin's Kensal Green in London and later when my voice changed I became a server or Altar Boy. I remember Lent and Easter as being a very busy time for services and there always seemed to be more weddings around Easter so the workload for the choir increased.

After Easter things slowed down and the church settled into its normal routine of Friday night choir practices (Also 'Wolf Cubs' on Friday nights) and three services on Sunday sometimes four if there was a baptism.

The organ being played Dr Vernon Parker (with various letters after his name) would sing out and lead all the services, apart from 'Said Communion', the choir would sing like angels (mostly) and would praise God by singing not just Hymns and Canticles but Psalms and choral pieces as well.

How wonderful to sing God's praises after the serious period of Lent and the joys and happiness of the resurrection of Jesus Christ and of the new found hope it gives us.

So why should we not raise a song and lift our souls by singing and playing musical instruments in praise of God. Psalm 150 says this very well:

Praise the Lord!

Praise God in his sanctuary;
praise him in his mighty firmament!

2 Praise him for his mighty deeds;
praise him according to his surpassing greatness!

3 Praise him with trumpet sound;
praise him with lute and harp!

4 Praise him with tambourine and dance;
praise him with strings and pipe!

5 Praise him with clanging cymbals;
praise him with loud clashing cymbals!

6 Let everything that breathes praise the Lord!

01 April All Fools' Day

In years gone by, the rules surrounding April Fool were this: between midnight and noon on 1 April, everyone is 'fair game' to be made a fool of. It is the morning of the practical joke. But the aim is not just to discomfort the victim: he must be tricked into taking action himself, sent on a 'fool's errand'.

And so children would be sent to the dairy for a pint of dove's milk, or to the bookseller for *The Life of Eve's Mother*. Practical jokes on a bigger scale were played: in 1860 a vast number of people received an official looking invitation to the Tower of London that read: 'Admit the Bearer and Friends to view the Annual Ceremony of Washing the White Lions.' Precisely the same trick had been played in 1698.

Then, on the stroke of noon, tradition decrees, April Fools is finished. If anyone attempts devilry thereafter, even while the clock is still striking, it recoils on his own head. A child would then race through the sing-song formula: 'April-Fool-Day's-past-and-gone-you're-the-fool-and-I-am-none!'

23 April St George - our patron saint

St George of the Golden Legend

The Saint of an English Army before he was Patron Saint of England, St George may have been a soldier, but he was no Englishman. He was an officer in the Roman army under Diocletian, who refused to abandon his faith during the Terror, and was martyred at Lydda in Palestine about the year 300 AD - supposedly 23 April. Over the years St George became the example of a Christian fighting-man, a powerful helper against evil powers affecting individual lives. He was the soldier-hero of the Middle Ages, of whom remarkable deeds were reported.

In the Golden Legend of the 13th century, Jacobus de Voragine gave St George a handsome write-up. The story runs thus:

One day, St George rode up to the heathen city of Sylene in Lybia, where he found the citizens in great distress. A neighbouring dragon had forced them to surrender two sheep each day for its dinner, and when the sheep gave out, two of their children; and now they were about to sacrifice the King's daughter, dressed as if for her wedding. St George encountered the little party by a stagnant lake, where the dragon lived, and persuaded the sobbing Princess to tell him why she was so miserable. At that moment the dragon appeared, looking inexpressibly revolting. The Saint charged, and drove his spear into the gaping mouth. To everyone's amazement, he tumbled the monster over and over.

Then St George borrowed the Princess's girdle, tied it round the dragon's neck, and persuaded her to lead it back to Sylene herself. The sight of her approaching with the befuddled dragon on its makeshift lead emptied the town. When the inhabitants timidly crept back, St George promised to behead the dragon if they would all believe in Jesus Christ and be baptised.

It was a most effective form of evangelism, for everybody said 'yes' at once. So 15,000 people were baptised, and four carts were commissioned to remove the dragon's body.

St George thus became a symbol of the war against evil, and is usually portrayed trampling the dragon of sin under his horse's hoofs. The Crusaders had a vision of him helping them against the Saracens at Antioch, during the first Crusade, and so brought the story of St George back with them from Palestine. Presently England put herself under the protection of the Saint. His day was declared a holiday in 1222. A red cross on a white field is the flag of St George.

21 April Anselm

the man who proved there is a God

Anselm is a good saint to remember next time someone asks you to prove that there is a God. His brilliant and original *Proslogion*, written 1077-8, sets out the 'ontological' proof for God's existence. Nearly ten centuries later, it is still studied by theological students as one of the great philosophical 'proofs' of God's existence.

Anselm was born at Aosta in 1033, the son of a spendthrift Lombard nobleman, whom Anselm detested. In time he decided to become a Benedictine monk, and joined Lanfranc's famous monastery at Bec (c. 1060). He became prior, then abbot. He was loved by his monks, appreciated for his sensitivity and intuitiveness. He remained friends also with Lanfranc, who had gone on to be Archbishop of Canterbury. After Lanfranc's death, Anselm reluctantly agreed to accept the job.

Archbishops did not have press offices in those days, but Anselm made his views on Church-versus-King known all the same, and they did not please the king. William Rufus exiled him in 1097 and King Henry I exiled him in 1103. Anselm was utterly committed to what he saw as the cause of God and the Church, and had no time for temporal politics. Peace between archbishop and monarch was not achieved until 1106.

Anselm spent the rest of his life in England. His theological stance of 'Faith seeking understanding' and 'the mind at faith's service' were the keys to his life and teaching.

Bishop's Message April 2016

Holy disruption and the prayer which Jesus taught us

This month Bishop Lee reminds us that God's Kingdom is often unsettling and messy. If we are going to pray 'Your Kingdom come' in spirit and in truth let us be ready to welcome rather than resist this.

For fans of science fiction the term 'disruptor' may well bring to mind the weapon used by the Klingons in Star Trek. For business people the term is likely to evoke a thrill or a shudder and a practice which can be as lethal to a company as the Klingon weapon was to the Starship Enterprise. Disruption has become a new *modus operandi* in commerce and describes the impact which radical and game-changing approaches can have on whole industries.

Disruption has come through the advent and application of technology which creates very different ways of operating and connecting with markets. Most of us are familiar with how smartphones have transformed consumer electronics. One small box now replaces an MP3 player, an electronic organiser, a satnav, a video player, and the remote for your TV. In fact, a smartphone can replace the TV itself. Companies such as Amazon and Google have recast an entire sector at the expense of former giants such as Sony. This is disruption.

Disruption has also been applied to the learning process and recognized as an essential requirement for learning itself. At the outset of the new leadership programme aimed at resourcing CofE bishops we were introduced to 'disruptive learning' – the immersion in new thinking and behaviours which may be enjoyable but can also confuse and produce anxiety. Disruptive learning affects how we see what is and generates fresh ways of seeing and acting which can be very uncomfortable.

In one of the parables of the Kingdom of Heaven recalled in Matthew chapter 13, Jesus compares God's Kingdom to a mustard seed which grows to become a tree in which the birds of the air make their nests. Through comparison with other texts of that period, some scholars are now questioning whether this seed was more akin to a weed than a cultivated plant. Paula Gooder likens its nature to mint in swiftly spreading beyond the patch in which it was planted. Such a mustard seed has a further disruptive quality about it in attracting 'the birds of the air', not usually great friends of the farmer and a term used in Jesus' day of the Gentile nations.

Through the lens offered by this parable, praying 'Your Kingdom come' means to invite and welcome disruption; God's Kingdom is neither neat nor predictable and once it takes root it may lead to a great deal of untidiness. We see this clearly with Jesus who was better known for attracting tax collectors and prostitutes than the reputable and respectable. And Jesus' disciples experienced highly disruptive learning, discovering for themselves that transforming work of God which was both exhilarating and deeply disturbing.

If we are serious about creating connections with God, with each other, and with our communities; if by the grace of God we are to make disciples, grow leaders, and engage with younger generations; this will not come without disruption - in our church life and in our personal life. To pray the Lord's Prayer with integrity requires you and me to invite and welcome God's disruptive work among us. I wonder whether this month you would dare to ask the Spirit of God to do a disruptive but holy work in you and your church fellowship before you utter those words which begin, Our Father..?
